Greetings from Sierra Madre! It is gratifying to report to you that everything we hoped to accomplish in 2023, we did. Our major two-year project is now complete, thanks to you and hundreds of other individuals and foundations who supported us. Most importantly, program delivery did not miss a beat!

- 1. **Program Update:** In 2023, we are on track to surpass last year's record of 1,045 unique individuals served (inperson, virtual, and hybrid). We anticipate serving around 1,100 individuals and intend to serve even more in 2024.
- 2. **Our New Home:** Our new home in Sierra Madre is all we hoped it would be and more. Our participants love it.
 - Thanks to the generosity of over 250 donors, we did not have to tap into our reserves to purchase or renovate our new building;
 - In October 2023, we surpassed our \$3,750,000 fundraising goal (raising \$3,799,857), thanks to the Pasadena Community Foundation and the Ralph M. Parsons Foundation who each donated \$50,000 for solar panels on our roof; and

Wednesday Family Night and the Return of Children's Corner

According to the National Institute of Health (2021), between 14% and 25% of cancer patients are parenting children aged 18 or younger. Psychosocial issues faced by children who have a parent diagnosed with cancer include difficulties with emotions, sleep, energy levels, concentration,

academic activities, peer and family relationships, and communication (Phillips, Prezio, Panisch, and Jones, 2021). Each year, CSC serves over 200 families with children aged 18 or younger. In this new era, we could not have asked for a more family-friendly neighborhood than Sierra Madre.

In October, CSC relaunched in-person Wednesday Family Night and other programs supporting children and families. Every Wednesday, families enjoy a free dinner followed by three separate support groups for patients, caregivers, and children ages 6-13. CSC's Children's Corner support group integrates arts, crafts, cancer education, music, relaxation techniques, and role playing to help children understand and express their emotions. These children discover that they are not alone, and practice coping skills.

Once per quarter, families come together for social events focused on celebrating life, family fun, and the power of community. Halloween Family Fun Night, co-hosted by the National Charity League, featured creative costumes, face painting, pumpkin decorating, and of course, candy. In December, child therapist and CSC support group facilitator Jordan Long, LMFT, will provide an educational workshop on how to speak to children about cancer.

We look forward to expanding our programs and services in 2024. Thank you for your continuing support, allowing us to be a "lifeline" for our participants.

Gain 2023 Tax Benefits by Giving to CSC

Your generosity to Cancer Support Community by December 31 could also be a present for yourself:

• If you itemize taxes, consider using cash to make a gift or pay off a

pledge. You may deduct gifts of cash up to 60 percent of your adjusted gross income (AGI) in 2023.

 Consider donating stock that has appreciated for more than a year to avoid paying capital gains taxes. You also may be eligible to deduct the fair market value of the donated securities.

- Do you have securities that are currently valued at less than original cost (cost basis)? If you decide to sell some of those at a loss, then in a process called **tax-loss harvesting**, capital losses can be used to offset capital gains and up to \$3,000 of ordinary income. Donors can then claim a charitable deduction if they donate cash from the sale proceeds.
- If you're 70-1/2 years old or more, making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from your IRA directly to CSC reduces your gross income, can fulfill your required minimum distribution, and may help you avoid a higher tax rate. For married couples, each spouse can make a QCD up to the \$100,000 limit for a potential total of \$200,000.

Change and growth have been the theme at CSC over the last few years... the pandemic necessitated virtual programs, and the end of the pandemic and our exciting move reenergized participation in in-person services. With increased demand, CSC is eager to serve! In the past three years, participation in support groups has reached record highs, leading to abundantly full groups and a need for more offerings.

Since 2022 CSC has added several new support groups, including a hybrid Men's Group; a virtual Young Adult Group; and in-person children's, caregiver, and patient groups.
