Cancer Support Community has nearly doubled support group offerings in the past few years. Some groups were formed in response to our growing participant base, while some were started proactively to better serve unique populations within our community. Now, with an increased demand for in-person programs, we have been striving to

offer more programs in our beautiful new facility. In particular, we added a new in-person Women's Support Group in early 2024 and a hybrid Men's Patient Group in 2023.

We have had a virtual Women's Support Group for a number of years, and given the consistent popularity and need for the group, Cancer Support Community started the new in-person group. Building upon the vitality of the Women's Group, we were inspired to add a hybrid group for men. Consistent with statistics on utilization of psychosocial support, our organization historically has served more women than men. However, the Men's Support Group ended up serving 34 men in the past year, which is unprecedented in our history of offering male support groups.

The importance of these unique groups cannot be understated. As the Women's Support Group facilitator and Program and Clinical Director, I can confirm that these groups provide a safe space for participants who feel more comfortable discussing vulnerable topics such as relationships, intimacy, and the physical changes from treatment with those who share the same gender identity and experience.

With a goal of serving more people than ever before in 2024, Cancer Support Community will build on the success of these groups by continuing to offer more in-person programs, and by building programs that address the unique needs of the participants we serve.


